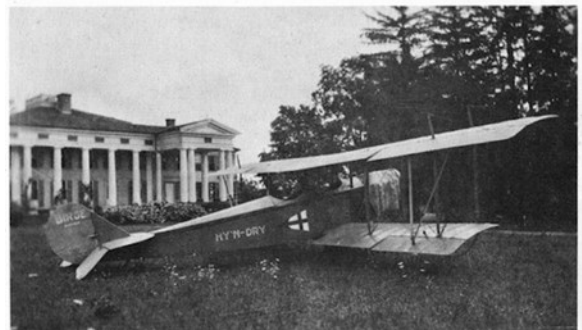

We are a repository of Town history and archives, which is located in the Wayne Town Hall. Our group:

- Collaborates with the Steuben County Historical Society, Dundee Area Historical Society and other local historical societies and museums.
- Preserves and protects historical documents, artifacts, photographs and other resources pertaining to the Town of Wayne and neighboring areas that were once a part of the Town; for example, the Village of Wayne.
- Assists Town residents and others with genealogy research and investigations.
- Maintains a history section on the Town of Wayne website.

IN THE BEGINNING

In March of 1796, Steuben County was formally formed from the south-eastern part of Ontario County.

The first six towns of the new county were established by the New York Legislature in April, 1801. They were: Bath, Canisteo, Dansville, Middletown, Painted Post and Fredericktown.

Fredericks aka Fredericktown was known to have been named for Frederick Bartles, a Revolutionary War Veteran from Prussia who had lumbering operations at Bradford. In early maps, Frederickstown was included in the area of present day Wayne Township. Frederickstown was changed to Wayne in 1808 to honor Revolutionary War Hero Anthony Wayne. What is now the Town of Wayne in the northeastern corner of Steuben County, New York, and bordering the middle section of the east side of Lake Keuka, was once a part of the territory of the Lamoka and later Seneca Indians.

OUR 2017 PROJECTS

Our first project was getting the 1930s sign showing the demarcation of Steuben/Schuyler County in the hamlet of Wayne restored. It is located on County Route 87 just as you enter Wayne in front of the old Town of Wayne Hall.

Our second project was writing a grant to procure a National Registry Historic Sign for the Central Point Historic District, which was placed on the National Registry of Historic Places in 2011. We received the grant and the sign will be placed in late May 2017.

Our third project was the beginning of placing four historic panels in the Town of Wayne. These panels will provide visuals and narratives of historic places in the Town. One will be placed in Keuka, one near the old Grove Springs Hotel site, one near the Aisle of Pines and one as you enter Wayne on Route 230. They should all be in place by Fall 2017.
