Wayne Canvas Business

Mr. and Mrs. Harrie E. Greene started working with canvas during the depression. What started out as a small business in their home quickly expanded into a 2400-square foot building in the middle of Wayne.

Their business came from cottagers and trailer tourists visiting the Keuka and Waneta Lakes area. They made car tops, sails, tents, boat covers, slip covers, awnings, hunting coats, hunting vests, and linings for leather coats. In addition to the lake area, they also did awning work in Corning, Elmira, Dundee, Penn Yan, Hammondsport, Watkins Glen, Montour Falls, Endicott, Binghamton, Hornell and small places in between. They occasionally sent their products as far as Boston.

During some of her spare time, Mrs. Greene came up with brightly colored canvas beach shoes. A Captain Rogerson for Pan-American Airways (Capt. Rogerson owned a cottage on Keuka Lake across from the old Clayton Sackett home) snatched up a pair, showed them to some of his friends and before she knew it, she was shipping the beach shoes not only to Miami but to Buenos Aires.

The Greens lived on Sylvan Beach and there are still those in the area who remember them. Their building still stands in Wayne as the Wayne Market.

Wayne Town Hall –News & Notes

The supervisor and town board members are beginning to calculate the **2019 budget**. Budget workshops are open to the public, however, no input from the public is allowed at that time. You may voice your approval or concerns at the public hearing prior to accepting the 2019 budget. Watch the website for dates.

The **town compost site** located on Co. Rt. 230 will continue to be open Fridays and Saturdays until mid-November, weather permitting. It will open again in the spring when the road into the site is passable. Be sure to get all your fall raking done before mid-November!

Speaking of mid November, regular rifle **deer hunting begins November 17th through December 9th**. Bow, crossbow, and muzzleloader hunting have different dates. Hunters, be sure to check your New York State Hunting and Trapping guide for specific dates and crucial information. Non-hunters? That is not the time to go for a walk in the woods.



The **2019 property tax bills** will start showing up in your mail boxes the last week in December, after the 25th. Follow up with the clerk to make sure the town has your correct mailing address. You don't want to miss your bill!!! Be sure to check with the Town Assessor to see if you are eligible for STAR exemption.

November 6th is General **Election Day** for all states in the US. What is going on in Washington DC? What's going on in Albany? How about in your own community? This is the day to make your voice heard. Your vote matters, or politicians, special interest groups, and foreign governments wouldn't be trying to so hard to change it. Voting is both a civil right, and a civil duty.
